
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

## **Notes**


When something is broken up into parts, a fraction shows how many of the parts you have. A fraction looks like this:




If you had a pizza cut in to 8 slices, and then you at some of it. A fraction could be used to describe how much pizza is left.




**Example 1:** What fraction of the shape is shaded?







